ACTING MAYOR KEEFE AND ROSSETTI-COWAN SENIOR CENTER ANNOUNCE FREE SHUTTLE SERVICES FOR MEMBERS STARTING JULY 1

This month the Rossetti Cowan Senior Center announced that beginning July 1, 2023, all seniors who are members of the Rossetti-Cowan Senior Center will no longer need to pay for shuttle services. Seniors must be members of the senior center and be over the age of 60 to utilize the shuttle.

"Our members are thrilled they no longer have to pay for the shuttle service," said Deb Peczk, Director of Elder Affairs. "Having just one less thing to worry about makes a world of a difference to them, and I'm thankful for Acting Mayor Keefe and CFO Richard Viscay's support of this change."

Currently the Senior Center has two vans to transport seniors to and from the Senior Center, to and from doctors and dentist appointments in Revere, and to and from Revere food shopping centers. The shuttle service, which is highly utilized by the Senior Center

Councillors concerned over concert traffic

The new 8,500-seat Stage at Suffolk Downs concert facility is scheduled to host its inaugural shows this weekend, with a three-day festival featuring Steve Lacy, LCD Soundsystem, and Boygenius.

Several city councillors have expressed concerns that the concerts will create more traffic in Revere, especially on Revere Beach Parkway when the

concerts end.

"It's my understanding there will be traffic after the summer concerts end and it will be directed into Revere onto Revere Beach Parkway from what I was told, and which is going to create more traffic on the Revere side," said Councillor-at-Large Gerry Visconti.

Visconti said the Orient Heights and East Boston community took part in a community meeting about the traffic and raised con-

cerns about the traffic funneling through their neighborhood, Visconti said.

"It's being directed into Revere Beach Parkway, which is right into the Revere neighborhoods, which I really have a concern about," said Visconti.

The councillor added that he was concerned that he and other councillors were not made aware of traffic mitigation plans and patterns for the con-

ConsComm approves plans for Leach, Sullivan Parks

The Revere Conservation Commission (ConsComm) held its regular monthly meeting last Wednesday evening, June 7, in the City Council Chamber. Chairman John Shue and fellow commissioners Joseph LaValle, Robert Cassidy, Samantha Woodson, Brian Averbach, and Nicholas Rudolph were on hand for the

meeting.

The commission first took up the continuation of hearing for a request for a Notice of Intent (NOI) from the City of Revere for improvements to Leach Park in Beachmont, which is a small, passive park space at the triangle formed by the junction of BROADSOUND and Leverett Aves. near Winthrop Parkway. At one point, homes had occupied the

park space, but they were brought out by FEMA after the storms of the 1980s had made it clear that they were highly-vulnerable to storm surge.

Danielle Osterman, the Community Development Program Manager for the city, presented the plan, which calls for the city to replace the fencing, add some more trees, and make the park fully-accessible. The city's original plan called for asphalt walkways throughout the park, which is what triggered the jurisdiction of the ConsComm. However, the city now will use stone dust, creating a permeable surface that will not impact the water flow or drainage in the area.

Shue noted that if the city had presented the stone-dust plan from the outset, the commission could have made a Determination of Applicability, which would have required no review by the ConsComm. However, the ConsComm has retained jurisdiction of the matter and approved the issuance of the NOI.

The commission also addressed changes to another park in a flood zone, Sullivan Park at Revere Beach. The commission's agenda for this item stated as follows: "Project Scope

certs.

Councillor-at-Large Steve Morabito noted that the council was informed when the plans were underway for the outdoor stadium, a point that Visconti did not dispute. Visconti said his issue was with the potential traffic.

“As far as the feedback I am getting from residents in Revere, they are excited about entertainment in Revere,” said Morabito. “I understand that we need to look at the traffic situation, but at the same time, I wouldn’t want to discourage an event like this.”

Visconti said he had no issue with the concerts themselves.

“My problem is that East Boston had a community meeting specifically about the traffic they didn’t want going through their area ... so they are pushing it all towards the Revere side,” said Visconti.

Councillors Marc Silvestri, Anthony Cogliandro, and Richard Serino also expressed some con-

cerns about the potential traffic when the concerts end.

“I go to a lot of concerts and a lot of sporting events, and that’s a lot of people to be funneling out one way into our city,” said Cogliandro. “Not only that, we have to think of our resources for our police department which is going to be guiding the traffic out.”

A spokesperson for the Stage at Suffolk Downs said the developer, the HYM Investment Group, and the promoter, The Bowery Presents, have worked in close partnership with the Boston Police Department, Revere Police Department, Massachusetts State Police and MBTA Police on a traffic management plan to aid the arrival and exit of guests at The Stage at Suffolk Downs. The spokesperson added that for the upcoming Re:Set Festival scheduled for June 16th-18th, the Summer Tunnel will be open and the MBTA Blue Line will be operating at full capacity.

term as the city’s representative on the Regional School Committee, said he has received clearance to serve on the two boards simultaneously if he is elected to the Revere School Committee in November.

Caggiano hopes to bring a broader emphasis on vocational education to the Revere school district.

“I decided to run for School Committee because for the past five or six years, there’s been a bigger demand for vocational education, and the last three years it’s completely exploded,” said Caggiano.

He noted that there has been a significant increase in the number of Revere

students that are applying for admission to Northeast Regional. Students from 12 communities in the Northeast school district, including Revere and Winthrop, attend the vocational high school which is in Wakefield.

“We have more than 200 students from Revere who are on the [Northeast] waiting list,” related Caggiano. “My goal is to bring vocational education programs to Revere High.”

According to Caggiano, in September Northeast Regional faculty will be teaching a plumbing course at Revere High School. “We haven’t had a shop at Revere High for about 30 years,” said Caggiano. “I want to expand

the vocational course offerings.”

Caggiano, who earned an impressive victory in his first run for office in November, 2020, points to a solid record of accomplishment as a Regional School committee member.

“When I was first elected, I met with Mayor [Brian] Arrigo and he felt the city needed a closer relationship between Revere and Northeast Regional, and I feel we have done that,” said Caggiano. “Currently, Northeast Regional students are helping with the renovations at the Revere Historical Society [Museum], providing plumbing, electrical, and HVAC services that are

saving the city a cost savings of hundreds of thousands of dollars. Northeast students are also going to be building new dugouts at the Revere High baseball field. And Northeast students have been volunteering at the Revere Food Pantry.”

Caggiano lauded the leadership of Supt. of Schools Dr. Dianne Kelly in the Revere School district, saying that he would enjoy the opportunity to work with the award-winning administrator on developing new vocational education programs for Revere students. “I feel we can’t wait for the new high school, we need to do it [add vocational training programs] now.”

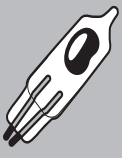

Chamber Is Told Welfare Work Is a Serious Problem

The regular monthly meeting of the Chamber of Commerce was held in the banquet room of the City Hall on Tuesday evening, June 7, at 8:30 o'clock and as this was the last meeting until Fall, many matters were discussed and voted upon by the members.

One of the subjects discussed was an inquiry from the International Glove Company, New York City asking what kind of encouragement and space Revere could offer them to come here and manufacture gloves. It was voted to communicate with these people and have them send a representative to Revere to look over what buildings we have vacant which will be large enough and light enough for their manufacturing.

A petition for Redress of Grievances to the President and Congress of the United States was read by Mr. Chisholm, in regard to the elimination of all expenditures for veterans of the World War who did not in fact suffer disability in war service. A motion was made that the resolution be adopted and that any members who desired sign it. Practically all members signed.

Mr. A. S. Hall stated he was very much impressed by the stand our Congresswoman, Mrs. Edith Rogers, took in her speech at the American Legion banquet in Lowell, when she said she would vote against the bonus bill in Congress. He stated if we are to be saved from bankruptcy we must take a firm and strong stand.

Mr. John M. Liset stated that the bill contemplating the taking over of the Eastern Mass. Street Railway by the Boston Elevated was signed by the Governor at 2:30 p. m. June 7. This will be of great benefit to Revere as it will now mean a ten-cent fare to all parts of Boston. This bill has been under discussion for some time.

Much discussion was given to the Public Welfare in Revere and Mayor Casassa stated that while there was no relief in sight at present the City has gotten along so far and hopes to in the future. Mr. Chisholm asked if the Chamber could be of any help and said they would be glad to hold a special session, but the Mayor felt they could not help right now. Mr. Charles Gilfix discussed the welfare conditions and said he thought all those on the list should be shut down until a rigid investigation is made to find out if some number of each family is not employed, or if there is not a married man or daughter able to care for an elderly or needy parent. He said the taxpayers are the sufferers and they cannot stand the strain much longer and that we should get as many off the welfare list as possible right away.

Both Mr. John M. Liset and Mayor Casassa stated that Revere has spent far less on Public Welfare than surrounding towns and cities. The Mayor stated that the annual budget was \$105,000 and on Monday night \$35,000 was appropriated, making a total of \$140,000 while the City of Chelsea will spend close to half a million this year on their needy. He also stated that while each family did not get much money from the Welfare Department no one in Revere was hungry or needy.

The drawing of the gold piece took place and the name of Mr. Harry J. Harding was drawn but inasmuch as he was not present it was returned to the treasury.

At the conclusion of the meeting the annual strawberry collation was served by the Entertainment Committee.

Revere Firemen to Hold Memorial Day Service on Sunday

On Sunday, June 12, the members of the Revere Fire Department, retired and active, will conduct their Memorial Day exercises at the First Baptist Church. The Rev. Arthur H. Swift, pastor, will officiate. Both active and retired members of the department will assemble at the Central Fire Station and will march in a body to the church where exercises will be held at 10:45 a. m.

Rev. A. H. Smith, members of the City Council and Fire Commissioner Harry Harding will take part in the exercises and it is hoped that relatives and friends of departed firemen will also honor their memory by their presence at the services.

His Honor, Mayor Andrew A. Casassa, was invited to be present, but will be unable to do so.

The members of the Department will assemble at Fire Headquarters on Broadway at 10:15 a. m. and, after a short parade, will proceed to the Church.

William Smith and Charles Golliff, active members of the department will visit twelve cemeteries and place 65 wreaths and several appropriate markers on the graves of their comrades, many of whom were killed in the service of their city.

During the past year five members have passed away and among them being Frank L. Smith, World War veteran to whose honor a public square was dedicated on May 30th. It is expected that music will be furnished by the Garfield Junior High School Band and the American Legion will provide a color guard. City Council Gets Facts About Oil Farm--Votes \$35,000 For Welfare Fund--Many Resolutions

In compliance with requests for information concerning plans of the Boston Port Development Co. and M. Thomas Green Trust for the so-called oil farm in Revere, M. Thomas Green submitted facts in the case in a letter read at a meeting of the City Council Monday night. In addition, plans were enclosed showing the layout, including industrial and waterfront areas and tables compiling additional data. The report was taken under advisement.

Mayor Andrew A. Casassa's request for appropriation of \$35,000 for the Public Welfare Department and \$10,000 for soldiers' relief was referred to the finance committee.

The name of Mrs. Ada Annis of 16 Payson st. was submitted by the mayor for appointment to the Board of Cemetery Trustees to succeed Mrs. Hattie M. Holt, who died recently. Resolutions were adopted in memory of Mrs. Holt.

A number of other resolutions were adopted as follows: Endorsing appointment of Edward F. Canavan as clerk of the Chelsea district court, endorsing attitude of School Committee's vote to remove married teachers whose husbands are working and

earning sufficient to provide for them, congratulating Senator Conde Brodine and Reps. Augustine Airola and Thomas F. Carroll on the success of their efforts in behalf of the bill for purchasing of the Eastern Mass. St. Railway Co. by the Boston Elevated Co., commending Chief Thomas J. McCarriek on his success in the fight against incendiarism in Revere and Charles P. Doherty, a teacher in the Revere Public Schools, on his election as state commander of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War.

An order was adopted requesting the mayor to have Peter F. Conley, investigate all amusements on the Revere Beach Boulevard, in order to ascertain the number of Revere citizens employed thereon.

Communication received from John A. Chisholm Camp, United Spanish War Veterans protesting the discharge by Mayor Casassa of Lieut. Clair P. Chainey, a member of the police department. Communication accepted and spread upon the records. The meeting in detail follows:

Ely Signs Bill To Permit Purchase of Local St. Railway

The Revere transportation bill, calling for the permissive purchase of the Chelsea division of the Eastern Massachusetts Street Railway by the Boston Elevated at a stipulated sum of \$1,750,000 at any time within the next five years, was enacted by the Senate Tuesday and signed by Governor Joseph B. Ely.

In order to become effective this legislation must be accepted by the Metropolitan Transit District, trustees of both the Elevated and the Eastern Massachusetts and the Public Utilities Commission.

By the terms of the bill, the residents of Revere will be given a single fare to any part of the Metropolitan transit area, whereas under the present system they have been forced to pay two fares.

Commencement week for the graduating class of the Immaculate Conception High School will come to a close Sunday evening with exercises in the Revere High School auditorium. The week started on Tuesday night with the class night program.

NOISE IS KILLING US

For those of us who live in the Greater Boston area, the noise that is all around us -- the roar of jets from the flight paths over our heads, the constant thrum of traffic on our bridges and expressways, the deafening sound of those obnoxious leaf blowers and lawn mowers, the harshness of motorcycles on our roads and of power boats (and those obnoxious jet skis) on the water, and the blare of sirens by fire engine and police vehicles (just to name the most obvious ones) -- is impossible to escape.

We always considered the constant noise to be a part of the background of our environment, the price we pay for living in the city. But the evidence is mounting that noise is much more than a mere annoyance -- it is killing us in subtle, yet measurable ways.

Researchers have found that noise doesn't merely affect our auditory senses (i.e., hurt our ears), but literally reverberates throughout our entire body. Noise causes a stress response in the brain that in turn triggers responses that snake their way along our cardiovascular and nervous systems.

The effects of noise are especially pernicious at nighttime because noise can interrupt a normal sleep pattern, thereby triggering a stress response even if the person does not recall being awakened.

Researchers at Mass. General who have analyzed the brain scans and health records of hundreds of patients report that those who live in areas with high levels of transportation noise are more likely to suffer from arterial inflammation and major cardiac events. Noise may even trigger heart attacks, and higher levels of aircraft noise have been tied to heart-related mortality.

It is estimated that 100 million Americans are subject to a level of noise that is harmful to our health. If the ill effects of noise are as bad as researchers say, it is not surprising that Americans' life spans are shorter -- even when taking into account our ongoing opioid epidemic, COVID, and high suicide rate -- than in countries that are not as "developed" as ours.

And for those of us who try to take care of ourselves by eating well, exercising, etc., it is very depressing to realize that the noise that surrounds us cancels out our best efforts at living a longer and healthier life.

THE MIRACLE IN THE AMAZON JUNGLE

The news this week of the rescue of the four children, ages 13, 9, 4, and 11 months, who survived in the depths of the Amazon jungle for 40 days after their small airplane crashed (killing the pilot, their mother, and another adult passenger) is nothing less than miraculous.

This part of the Amazon in Colombia is so remote that it took two weeks for rescuers just to locate their plane and then five more weeks to track down the children.

The children are members of an indigenous tribe who teach their children about the wonders -- and the dangers -- of the jungle. According to a statement from the Organization of the Indigenous Peoples of the Colombian Amazon, the children's survival was "a sign of the knowledge and relationship with the natural environment of life, which is taught and learned from the mother's womb and is practiced from a very early age."

The childrens' maternal grandmother said that the eldest child, a 13-year-old girl, had a "warrior"-like nature and their grandfather said the 9- and 4-year-old brothers were very "skilled" at walking through the forest.

They knew what fruits and seeds they could eat and which ones to avoid, how to capture water, and were aware of the many types of venomous snakes that live in the jungle. During the night, they slept in tree trunks to avoid predators.

Needless to say, as one expert noted, "Four Western kids of the same age would have died" there. In fact, we'd add that everyone reading this column would have died in the jungle, save perhaps for someone who has undergone wilderness training in the military.

The childrens' story of their survival illustrates how far removed we in the so-called "civilized world" are from nature -- most of us can't even avoid poison ivy or ticks in our own backyards. It also should make us ask this question: Are we better off with the life we have created, or have we sown the seeds of our own demise by our intentional destruction of the natural environment?

IN SUPPORT OF SUMNER TUNNEL MITIGATION

Dear Editor,

As the former Superintendent of the Sumner/Callahan Tunnels and Boston Transportation Commissioner I fully support the MassDOT mitigation program for the Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project. This extensive infrastructure investment project is vitally needed to assure the continued structural integrity of the nearly 100-year-old tunnel whose

structural failure would have devastating consequences for East Boston as well as the region's transportation network. I remember my first day in 1990 in charge of the Tunnels when I discovered that the Sumner Tunnel ceiling was on the verge of collapse from corroded hanger rods, a potential calamity especially during rush hour. I immediately closed the tunnel and initiated a complete ceiling replacement project. To MassDOT's great credit the current Sumner Tun-

nel Restoration Project is designed to avoid such an event which would be a calamity for East Boston. The two-month Project mitigation program includes free Blue Line service for the entire route plus an additional daily train, a free Eastie ferry service, additional ferry service between Boston and the North Shore, discounted Tobin Bridge tolls for East Boston EZ pass residents, and other Measures. MassDOT's decision to change the Restoration project schedule so

that it will occur during the traditionally slowest traffic period of the year is also a significant mitigation commitment.

All in all, the Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project is absolutely required for public safety and continuity of essential transportation programs serving the region, including East Boston. The comprehensive mitigation program ought to continue to evolve.

CFO begins subcommittee hearings with overview of FY24 budget

The City Council’s ways and means subcommittee began its public hearings on a proposed \$262,146,012 budget for Fiscal Year 2024.

Richard Viscay, the city’s Chief Financial Officer, provided an overview of the budget to kick off the hearings, stating that the proposed FY24 budget is a responsible, balanced budget.

The budget breaks down to a little over \$49 million for the municipal costs, \$124 million for school costs, and \$53 million for fixed costs, such as employee benefits, insurance, debt service, and pension costs that are shared by the city and the schools. In addition, the water and sewer and solid waste enterprise accounts are budgeted at \$36,609,112 for FY24.

Viscay ran through some of the key factors in the proposed budget. The education costs include funding for the Revere Public Schools, as well as the operating and debt service costs for the Northeast Vocational High School. The Northeast Voke portion of the education budget is just under \$2.3 million.

In the public works budget of \$4,687,551, Viscay said some of the key fac-

tors include the construction of the new DPW facility, which is scheduled to open in the late summer or early fall.

Several of the city departments, including health and human services and the culture and recreation departments will see some streamlining of services in the proposed budget, Viscay said.

The community engagement and Substance Use Disorder and Homelessness Initiative (SUDHI) departments will be absorbed into the Public Health budget “to create a streamlined organizational structure with program managers and staff reporting directly to the Chief of Health and Human Services,” Viscay said. In addition, the Travel and Tourism department will be merged with Parks and Recreation, with operational funding through ARPA federal relief funds.

There will be a separation of the Building Commission, with all building, plumbing, and electrical staff relocated from Municipal Inspections to a newly created Building Commission department. Viscay said there will be no new employees added to the new department.

Highlights of the public safety budget include the full funding of 11 new

firefighters hired in FY23, increasing the total staffing of the department to 119. Viscay also noted that the new Point of Pines fire contract has been signed, with construction of the \$16 million facility beginning this month.

There are five new police officers budgeted for FY24, increasing the total staffing for that department to 115.

Viscay also gave an overview of how the city expects to pay for the FY24 budget. The major revenue sources for the city are the property tax levy, including new growth; local receipts; state aid; other financing sources; and enterprise fund revenue which primarily funds the city’s water and sewer and solid waste enterprise accounts.

The FY23 tax levy limit was \$107,656,370. Under Proposition 21/2, the city can add 21/2 percent to the FY23 limit, for an additional \$2.7 million.

In addition, Viscay said the estimated new growth for FY24 is just under \$2.4 million, bringing the estimated FY24 tax levy limit to \$112,731,779.

“The tax levy limit is the maximum taxes that the City can raise as part of balancing its budget,” Viscay said.

The FY24 estimated

state aid figure is just over \$114 million, with the majority of that coming as Chapter 70 funds that can only be used for education purposes. The estimated Chapter 70 amount of \$98.5 million is a \$12 million increase from FY23.

In comparison, the state Unrestricted General Government Aid figure for the municipal government rose by 3.2 percent to an estimated \$12.3 million.

Local receipts are revenues received and collect-

ed that are not reserved for a special purpose. Those revenues, which include vehicle excise taxes, licenses and permits, meals and rooms excise taxes, and investment income, are expected to increase 11.8 percent from FY23 to \$21,170,000.

Viscay also noted that all collective bargaining agreements in the city are settled through the end of June in 2024, and that there will be a comprehensive salary and benefit

analysis coming in FY25.

Once the FY24 budget is passed, Viscay said there will be a new, long-range financial plan that will be updated with a long-range forecast incorporating the cost of building a new Revere High School.

Ways and means subcommittee hearings on the individual department proposed budgets are expected to continue through this week and the beginning of next week.

Question about a new pipe route for the splash feature at Sullivan Park by the DCR.” Sullivan Park is located on Revere St. at Revere Beach Blvd. and is bounded by Diamond Creek on the west and a large condo building on the north. The park, which has been a little-used and neglected softball field for decades, is set to undergo a radical transformation by the DCR, whose plans for the project previously had received the ConsComm’s approval in February of 2022.

However, DCR has revised its plan so that a water feature in the park will drain into the DCR’s existing drainage system on Revere Beach Blvd., rather than toward Diamond Creek at the rear of the park.

Skyler Chick, an engineer with the landscape firm of Shadley Associates, explained that initially, the plan had called for the water from the water feature to flow into the park’s overall storm water system, which drains toward Diamond Creek, but the engineers are now recommending that the water feature drain into the DCR’s existing system on the boulevard. There also will be the need for a pump to direct that water up toward Revere Beach Blvd.

Chick asked that the new plan not be deemed a change such that it would trigger the need for a new NOI and Order of Conditions. The commissioners unanimously agreed with his request, thereby accepting the revised plan

without the necessity of the DCR going through the NOI process.

The commission briefly took up a request for a Notice of Intent for the construction of a single-family home on land subject to Coastal Storm Flowage on Neponset St. Thorson Akerley, a wetlands scientist with the firm Williams & Sparages of Middleton, presented the application to the commission.

He said the owner wishes to construct a single-family home with two off-street parking spaces. The foundation, which will be a full foundation with holes to allow for ocean storm surge to flow, will be elevated so that the first floor of the home will be two feet above the base flood plain. Akerley said the plan will incorporate a pervious driveway and a system for the drainage of rainwater from the roof to handle typical rain events.

Speaking in opposition to the proposal was a next-door neighbor, who has lived for 32 years at 22 Neponset St. She said the present vacant lot is flooded every time it rains and she said she fears that if a new home is built on the lot, that the water will flood her property.

Shue, who noted that the lot is for sale, suggested that the matter is not ready for action by the ConsComm because the city’s Site Plan Review Board still has the matter under review. The commissioners then voted to continue the request for an NOI until their July meeting.

The commission grant-

ed two extensions for the completion of projects. The first was a request from the DCR for its routine operations and maintenance (O&M) of Revere Beach, including the disposal of sand, dead animals, etc., and with no construction. The first NOI was for three years and the commission voted to give the DCR another three-year extension.

The second extension pertained to the construction of a single-family home by Hugo Rizzuto at 265 Rice Avenue. Shue said that Rizzuto has encountered the usual delays with construction because of supply-chain issues. The commissioners unanimously voted to give him an extension for 18 months.

Revere students receive Seal of Biliteracy Award

Over 60 Revere High School seniors were recently recognized for their strong multilingual skills at the second annual Revere Public Schools Bilingual Awards Ceremony on May 25. The award ceremony honored recipients of four awards, including the Massachusetts State Seal of Biliteracy.

The Seal of Biliteracy is given by the RPS Multilingual Learner and World

Language Department on behalf of the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education in recognition of graduating seniors who have studied and attained a high level of proficiency in two or more languages. Nine different partner languages were represented among this year's award recipients: Spanish, Portuguese, French, Italian, Modern Standard Arabic, Egyptian Arabic, Haitian Creole, Krio, and Hindi.

Awards were broken into four categories, with some students receiving awards in more than one language. Of the 63 honorees, 13 students received the highest honor: the Massachusetts Seal of Biliteracy with Distinction for advanced proficiency. 41 students received the Massachusetts Seal of Biliteracy, 6 received the Language Opportunity Coalition award, and 10 received Revere Public Schools Awards. Students earning the Seal of Biliteracy received medals to wear at graduation and official certificates of achievement. The Seal of Biliteracy is also noted on student transcripts and many colleges and universities offer credits for students who receive the honor.

In addition to demonstrating their language

skills on assessments, students were also asked to write an essay in both languages in which they discuss the impact of bilingualism on their lives. Student work was published in "Our Voices: A Multilingual Anthology"

At the ceremony, several students read excerpts from their bilingual essays, sang songs in their partner languages, and shared original poetry. Other speakers included Acting Mayor Patrick Keefe, Jr., Assistant Superintendent Dr. Lourenco Garcia, RHS Principal Christopher Bowen and Deputy Principal Caitlin Reilly.

DA Hayden warns public of scammers claiming to be with the Suffolk DA's office

Suffolk District Attorney Kevin Hayden today warned the public of scammers attempting to steal money by claiming to be representatives of his office on phone calls to potential victims.

Hayden said the callers identified themselves as workers in the Suffolk County District Attorney's office and told those answering the calls that they owed money and must pay to avoid prosecution. At least two such calls have been reported to Hayden's office.

"The district attorney's office never calls anyone and demands money. If you get a call like this, hang up immediately and contact your police department. This is another variation on a scam we see quite often and we hope no one is victimized by it," Hayden said.

Suffolk County District Attorney Kevin Hayden's office serves the communities of Boston, Chelsea, Revere, and Winthrop, Mass. The office handles over 20,000 cases a year. More than 160 attorneys in the office practice in nine district and municip-

pal courts, Suffolk Superior Court, the Massachusetts Appeals Court, the Supreme Judicial Court, and the Boston Juvenile Courts. The office employs some 300 people and offers a wide range of services and programs to serve anyone who comes in contact with the criminal justice system. 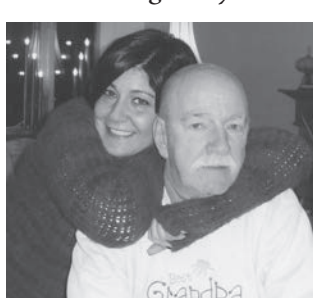

Logan Airport runway rehab will impact Revere

MassPort officials met with the City Council recently to discuss the upcoming closure of Logan Airport’s longest runway for repairs and the impact it will have on Revere.

“That closure is going to be for 100 days beginning August 15, with a re-opening sometime in early November,” said Anthony Guerriero, the deputy director of community relations in federal affairs for Massport. “This is a safety rehabilitation project; 15 Right, 33 Left is our lon-

gest runway.”

Each runway at Logan is generally rehabilitated for safety reasons every 10 to 12 years.

In considering when to close the runway for repairs, Guerriero said Massport looked at winds and other factors to determine when that runway sees less use.

“This runway is used typically in northwest winds and it is our largest runway at the airport,” said Steve Sulprizo of Massport. “The bigger portion of the impact our com-

munities will see is this is our preferred overnight runway configuration because it utilizes over-water routes for both arrivals and departures. The communities will see a bit of an increase in some of the overnight traffic since that runway will be closed.”

There will be an increase in arrivals to runway 22 Left, which will impact the Point of Pines and Beachmont neighborhoods, Sulprizo said. Because the runway that is being closed sees a large amount of overnight traf-

fic, he said there is a high probability there will be increased overnight flights over the Revere neighborhoods.

Guerriero noted that runway use is determined by weather patterns on a day-by-day basis by the FAA.

Several city councillors said there is a need for increased soundproofing for residents and other buildings in the city, given the increase in air traffic over time.

Council President Pro Tempore Joanne McK-

enna said that the flight ceiling is getting lower from approximately 400 feet to 200 feet due to the larger air buses coming in and out of Logan. McKenna also asked about the installation of soundproof windows for the Beachmont School through the FAA sound insulation program.

Guerriero indicated that the program is currently only for residential property, but the FAA may consider schools in the future.

Revere resident Ron

Clark asked why the project had to take place during August when most residents have their windows open during the summer. MassPort responded that August is a slower month for air travel and paving must be done during construction season. Angela Sawaya of the Point of Pines Beach Association inquired about the residential sound program for Point of Pines residences and the dumping of fuel over the Point of Pines, which has caused her roof to turn black.

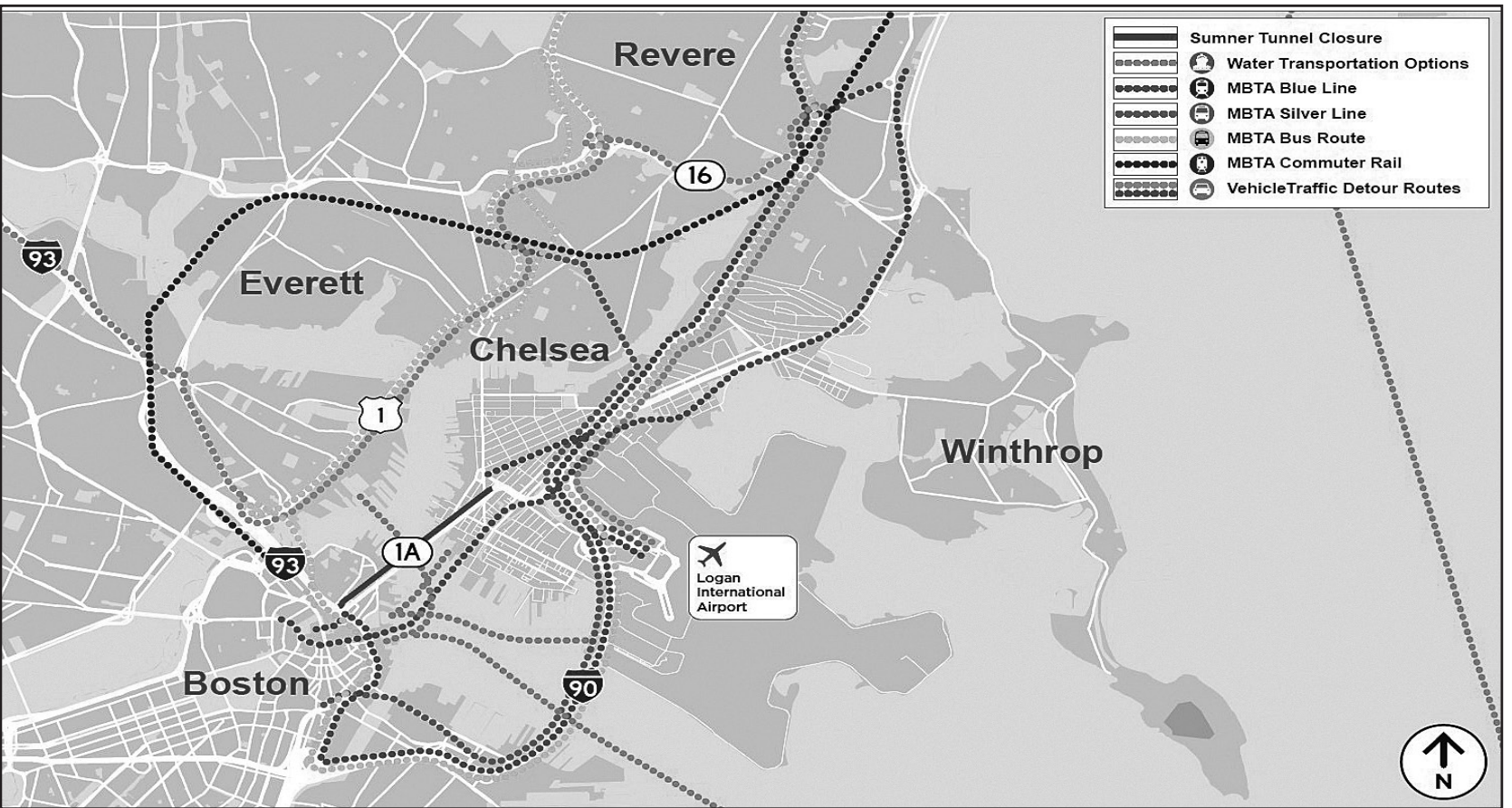
MassDOT announces alternative travel options ahead of Sumner Tunnel closure

The Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) today announced a comprehensive mitigation plan to address travel impacts and provide cost effective alternative transportation options for residents and visitors ahead of the scheduled closure of the Sumner Tunnel from Wednesday, July 5, through Thursday, August 31, 2023. The tunnel will be fully closed for approximately two months to facilitate work on the Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project.

The Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project will offer a variety of mitigation options for individuals coming from all travel points, including free trips on the MBTA Blue Line for the during the tunnel’s closure; free and reduced cost water ferry options; reduced Commuter Rail fares for riders; reduced parking costs at MBTA and Commuter Rail parking lots and garages; discounted tolls for residents; and additional options for travelers to and from Logan Airport.

In addition to providing the East Boston Ferry as a free transit option,

the MBTA has added a new ferry service between Lynn and Central Wharf in Boston to provide an additional transit option during the Sumner Tunnel closure.

These are preliminary measures and MassDOT and the MBTA will continue to consider additional mitigation options as

well as new and innovative approaches to modes of transportation.

“We know the closure of the Sumner Tunnel will be a daily impact to those living, working, and traveling in this region,” said Transportation Secretary and CEO Gina Fiandaca. “The Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project is a crucial investment in transportation infrastructure in the Commonwealth, and we are working hard to provide as many mitigation measures as possible to those impacted. I want to thank our partners for their efforts in creating mitigation options while this work is ongoing, and our residents and travelers for their willingness to explore alternative travel options over the next two months.”

“Since launching the Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project last year, we have been working closely with our partners to identify any and all mitigation measures we can put in place,” said Highway Administrator Jonathan Gulliver. “Our message to residents and those traveling is when moving through this area, if possible, leave your car at home and explore the MBTA’s transit options, including the Blue Line, Commuter Rail, and ferry service options available to you.”

“I’m pleased that together with MassDOT, the MBTA is able to offer free Blue Line service to those impacted by the Sumner Tunnel closure this summer,” said MBTA General Manager Phillip Eng. “The MBTA has been working hard to reduce travel times on the Blue Line in anticipation of this project. We have the capacity needed on the Blue Line to serve our existing and new customers on this line, and I encourage those who can to take advantage of this free service in July and August.”

Additional details on mitigation options are below:

Travel To/From East Boston And North End MBTA Blue Line and Parking

The entire Blue Line in both directions will be free to riders. Gates will be open at all Blue Line stations from Wonderland to Bowdoin.

An additional train will be added to the Blue Line in the midday period to help support more riders riding the line.

All MBTA parking lots and garages on the Blue Line will be reduced to \$2/day. Additional free parking is available near Wood Island Station.

Visit mbta.com/Sumner for additional information.

Discounted Tolls

Discounted tolls will be provided for the Tobin Bridge and Ted Williams Tunnel for those registered in the Resident Discount Program.

Real Time Traffic monitoring will be available at 13 local intersections.

East Boston Ferry

The East Boston ferry will be free during the tunnel’s closure.

The East Boston ferry service project operates between East Boston at Lewis Mall and the downtown Boston area at Long Wharf. East Boston ferry service schedules are available online with all ferry service schedules available at mbta.com/ferry.

Travel To/From The North Shore Commuter Rail and Parking

Zone 1A (\$2.40) fares from Salem and Swampscott Commuter Rail. Parking at Salem and Swampscott is just \$2 per day.

Free parking at lots north of Salem, including Beverly, Gloucester, Hamilton/Wenham, Newburyport, North Beverly, Monserrat, Rowley, and West Gloucester.

Blue Line benefits also apply. Travelers are encouraged to utilize the

Wonderland Station parking lot if coming from the North Shore.

Lynn Ferry

The Lynn Ferry will operate between the Blossom St. dock in Lynn to Central Wharf in Boston (near Aquarium).

Free parking at the City of Lynn-owned lot will be available near the Blossom St. dock. Bicycles are allowed on the ferry.

Riders may use a Zone 1A fare (\$2.40).

The Lynn Ferry will operate five days/week on weekdays only, with 10 trips per day. Schedules are being finalized and will be released as soon as they’re available.

Travel To/From Logan Airport

Logan Express There will be a 25% discount when you buy tickets online, and children under 17 ride free.

Adding additional parking capacity at Braintree Logan Express.

MBTA Silver Line (SL1 & SL3) buses can use the I-90 EB Emergency Ramp.

“Skip the Security Line” at Logan will be available for all water transportation users (must show ticket).

Added stop at Logan Airport by the Winthrop Ferry.

MassDOT also has a working partnership with public safety agencies and Boston EMS to support public safety during the Sumner Tunnel closure.

There will be two dedicated ambulances for East Boston, two rotating ambulances to support the day shift, two rotating ambulances to support the evening shift, and one rotating ambulance to support the overnight shift.

As part of the public outreach process, over the last five years MassDOT has engaged with a wide range of community stakeholders, large employers, advocates, trade organizations, and community groups. A hands-on approach has been

undertaken to inform as many people as possible about the Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project – including pop-up information sessions at various little league fields, community events, food pantries, and neighborhood associations. Built in the 1930s, the Sumner Tunnel is the first traffic tunnel in Massachusetts and one of the oldest in the nation. The Sumner Tunnel is one of four ways into the City of Boston and processes over 39,000 vehicles per day and is the main connection for East Boston, Logan Airport, and a main entry point for the North Shore.

The Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project is a \$160 million investment in the Commonwealth’s infrastructure. The project’s scope includes removing and replacing the tunnel ceiling and repairing the overhead arch; demolishing and replacing the tunnel deck and roadway surface; repairing tunnel walls and installing fireproof panels; installing new LED lights inside the tunnel; upgrading CCTV and fire alarm systems; installing new utility conduits and cables under the bridge deck; and focusing on environmental resiliency with new equipment that will reduce air pollution and improve storm readiness.

This period between July 5 and Labor Day historically has the lowest traffic volumes of the year and is outside of the school year making it much more manageable for traffic management. A second full closure of the Sumner Tunnel will then occur in the summer of 2024, for approximately two months during a similar period between July and August.

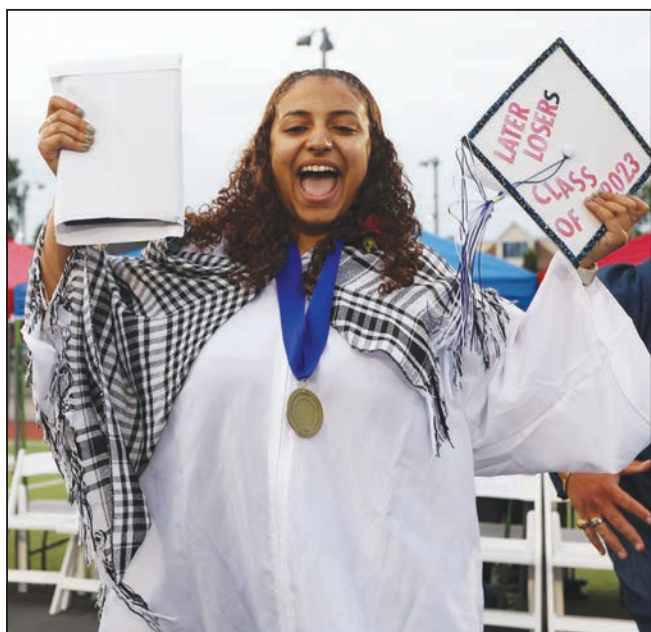

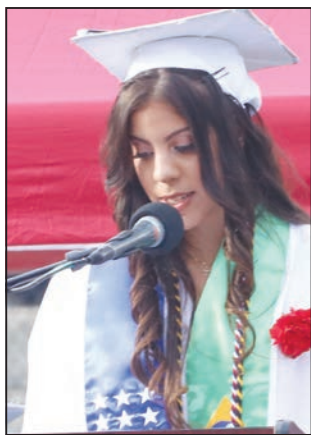

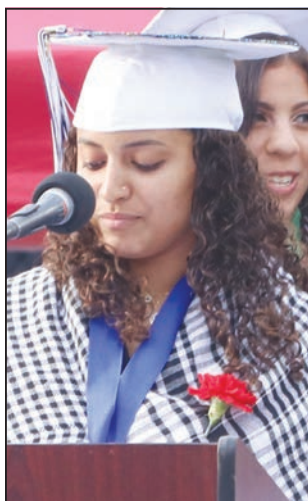

Thank you to Emma, Madison, and Rou, for creating the Feminist Empowerment Movement with me and for all of our amazing work over the past four years, and thank you to Mr. Carlson and Ms. DiNolo for their endless support every step of the way. Thank you to Ms. Casper, for her kindness, and Mr. Costello, for listening to my worries. Thank you to Mr. Nguyen, who brightens my days, and Josh, who inspires my creativity. Thank you to Coaches Maniscalco and McGonigle, who fuel my competitiveness.

Thank you to Kathleen and Hebat, who've been there for all of my cries, and thank you to Kathy and Chime, who make me laugh at the stupidest of things. And finally, thank you to my parents and my siblings, Amy and Billy. I would not be where I am today without them.

And with that... Congratulations everyone! We're finally here, in our fancy caps and gowns. Standing here on this stage, it still feels surreal to me that... this is it. This is our last day as high schoolers. No more wheezing after walking from the East Wing to the third floor, no more bathroom doors without locks. No more pushing past freshmen oddly taller than us in the halls, and definitely no more begging Dianne Kelly for a snow day.

As I saw examples of graduation speeches online, I noticed a common formula. Step one: the congratulations and thank you's. (We're off to a good start). Step two: talk about entering high school as a nervous, awkward freshman. I should talk about waiting outside Ms. Goldman's first period with my classmates, back when we all thought we needed to get to class on time. I should talk about the labs from Ms. O'Hara's biology class, or the after school trips with friends to the old Dunkin'.

But this formula doesn't include the absolute longest "two week break" anyone has ever had. We don't exactly fit the

cookie-cutter high school experience. We skipped step 3: adjusting to school, no longer getting lost around the building, and instead, got lost in our emails of Zoom links. We skipped step 4: forming new connections through clubs and sports, and instead, recognized people by their names or anime profile pictures in the Google Classroom.

Our high school years have been marked by uncertainty. Uncertainty from what this "coronavirus" is. Uncertainty from loved ones or yourself getting COVID. Uncertainty from how long we were going to stay at home.

When we re-entered the high school building our junior year, the joy from seeing others in person again was still tainted with uncertainty.

How do I talk to the people in my class? What do I do if I get COVID? How do I study? What is 'sine' and 'cosine'?

And at the end of our first full year in school came The Question: What do you want to do after high school?

This caused one of two responses: panic, or procrastination. What do you mean after high school? We were asked to think about our futures when we just started to enjoy the present. And so came the pressure to suddenly figure ourselves out and have our lives in perfect order.

But for some of us, this pressure to figure out who we are and what we want to do wasn't only for our sake.

Many of us here come from immigrant parents, working class families, or both. My story is not an uncommon one. My parents immigrated here from Vietnam, from post-war poverty, working towards a better life. I'm sure many of us resonate with the sentiment, "My family sacrificed so much for me."

We were navigating what we wanted for our futures not just for ourselves, but for our family. We've grown up with this pressure our entire lives.

Pressure to do well in school. Pressure to be a good role model for your

younger siblings and cousins. Pressure to support your family by working. Pressure to be the ripe fruits of our parents' labor, for all that they have sown and given up for us.

It can feel paralyzing, then, being under all this pressure, and being expected to know what exactly the next ten years of your life will look like. To be exactly who your parents or others wish you to be.

But something I've learned is that others' expectations do not, and should not, shape who you are. When we aim to make others proud, sometimes, that comes at the hefty cost of our own happiness.

As we leave high school, now is a time of change, growth, and self discovery. We have an opportunity to live for ourselves and take ownership of our happiness.

Who do you want to be? What is the life you want to live?

Maybe you're someone who always knew what your dream career is. Maybe you're someone who had a eureka moment, a realization of what your true calling is. Maybe you're someone who doesn't know. You're here, you made it, and you're not sure what you want to do.

And that's okay.

Be kind to yourself. When we face our hurdles, when we inevitably feel lost, the reminder of others' efforts may feel like a heavy weight on us.

But we are not defined by who precedes us, and we are not defined by others' expectations.

As we struggle to create our own definition, remember that our future will always hold some uncertainty. But through the uncertainty, there's something that we do know.

As Marie Kondo puts it, ask yourself, "Does this spark joy?"

As we say our good-byes to each other tonight - some final, some not - through the bittersweet tears or smiles of sheer happiness, I hope you all remember what, or who, sparks joy for you. Because your happiness is worth far more than anything else.

You will not know what will happen in the next few years, and that's okay. At the end of the day, what matters is you, at this moment. Who are you? And what sparks your joy?

I wish you all luck in our journeys to our own happiness, and I am so, so proud of you all.

Olympic bronze medalist Abdurakhmonov is soaring in his Mixed Martial Arts career

Renowned boxing trainer Joe Lake is in the champion's corner

There is an Olympic bronze medalist wrestler living in the Boston area who is taking the world of Mixed Martial Arts by storm.

Bekzod Abdurakhmonov, who resides in Watertown, will take a 6-0 record into his next MMA fight June 16 as he continues his training for the 2024 Olympics in Paris.

Abdurakhmonov, who is 5-feet-11 and 163 pounds, won a bronze medal in the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo after reaching the bronze medal match in the 2016 Summer Olympics.

Aburakhmanov is also a volunteer assistant wrestling coach at Harvard. His brother, Muzaffar Abdurakhmonov, is an assistant coach for the Crimson.

"I want to compete in this (MMA) fight, and then in September, I'll be in the World (Freestyle Wrestling) Championships, which is a qualifier for the Olympics," explained Abdurakhmonov. "Then I'll seek more MMA fights. Once I'm done wrestling, I'll return to MMA fighting."

Abdurakhmonov, who was twice voted athlete of the year in his homeland of Uzbekistan, a nation of 35 million people, has enlisted the aid of renowned boxing trainer, Joe Lake, in his career. Lake, who guided middleweight boxer Dana Rosenblatt's championship ascension,

has been working with Abdurakhmonov at Combat Sports in Boston.

"I my opinion, Joe Lake is one of the greatest boxing coaches of all time," said Abdurakhmonov. "He's been with us since the beginning. He's not just a coach, he's a great person. You need a coach and mentor that just doesn't teach you boxing - he has to be able to balance your workouts. Joe has the wisdom to structure my training sessions, so overall, he's the best guy to have around."

Lake is excited about his fighter's superior skill and athleticism and the work ethic he brings each day to the gym.

"He won the bronze medal in a very tough division in the Olympics, and now he's hoping to win the gold," said Lake. "He's a two-time athlete of the year in Uzbekistan, so he has a lot of credentials. He'll probably be the most highly decorated, active wrestler fighting in the UFC when they sign him. And I'm expecting a victory in September [in the World Championships]. One thing about working with Bek, he gives you 110 percent. He's very respectful. He comes to the gym and he works hard."

And together, Bek and Joe, are advancing to Olympic gold and MMA superstardom

Appreciates his brother's shining example
Abdurakhmonov also

credits his brother for his phenomenal career in wrestling and his entrance into MMA.

"He's the reason I'm involved in all of this," said Abdurakhmonov. "He's the reason I got involved in wrestling and MMA. All this stuff I'm doing, he has done, so I took after him. When he was wrestling for the world championship in my hometown (his brother won the silver medal), I was there with my family and friends rooting for him. That's how I got excited and began wrestling."

Mayor Dan Rizzo submitted his City Budget proposal to the Council in a Late Communication on Monday night – pointing out that it was his administration's first attempt at totally revamping a budget process that has remained unchanged for decades. The numbers in the budget show a 5.5 percent increase over last year, or \$8.056 million. The total for the proposal is \$154,060,170 – with \$68.8 million of that going to the public schools. The budget has increased by \$16.05 million since Mayor Rizzo took office in 2012. It has increased \$48.8 million since 2005.

A Revere High School sophomore track athlete has filed a lawsuit in Suffolk Superior Court against the New York Post for publishing a story on April 18th that falsely identified him and a friend from Malden as possibly being the Boston Marathon Bombers. The Victims

Many attacks reported by letter carriers came from dogs whose owners regularly stated, “My dog won’t bite.” Dog bites are entirely preventable. One bite is one too many.

Being Attentive While Delivering

Letter carriers are trained to observe an area where they know dogs may be present. They are

taught to be alert for potentially dangerous conditions and to respect a dog’s territory.

Letter carriers are trained to:

- Not startle a dog;
- Keep their eyes on any dog;
- Never assume a dog will not bite;
- Make some noise or rattle a fence to alert a dog if entering a yard;
- Never attempt to pet

or feed a dog; and

- place their foot against an outward swinging door to prevent a dog from escaping.

If a dog attacks, carriers are also trained to stand their ground and protect their body by placing something between them and the dog — such as a mail satchel — and to use dog repellent, if necessary.

Even though postal officials ask customers to

control their dogs, bites still happen and may result in injuries to carriers and costly medical expenses for dog owners. Please heed the above best practices to help stop dog bites and protect your mail carrier.

“Recently, I was delivering to a customer’s mailbox and was nearly bitten by their large aggressive dog,” said Swain Lowe, a letter carrier in Manassas, Virginia. “Despite the dog

being behind a fence, it still managed to jump over and charge me. Thankfully, I was aware of it and remembered not to run but to turn and use my satchel as a shield to prevent what could have been a terrible bite.”

Carriers have tools to alert them to dogs on their routes. A dog alert feature on carriers’ handheld scanners can remind them of a possible dog hazard, and dog warning cards may be

used during mail sorting to alert carriers to routes where a dog may interfere with delivery.

Lastly, when a carrier feels unsafe, mail service could be halted — not only for the dog owner, but for the entire neighborhood. When mail service is stopped, mail must be picked up at the Post Office. Service will not be restored until the aggressive dog is properly restrained.

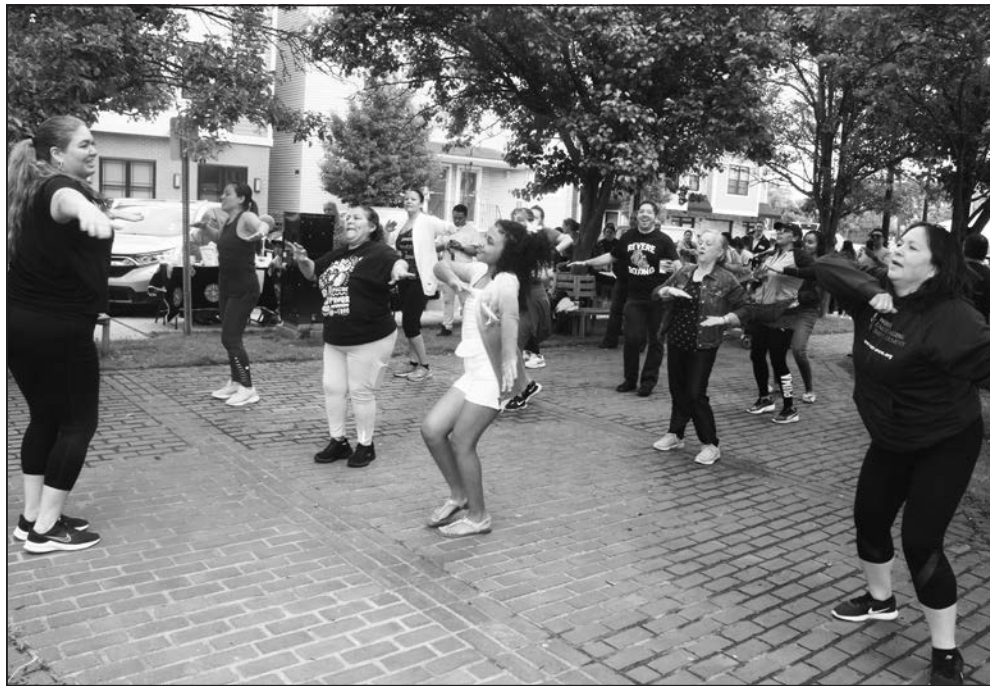
